EVENT SUMMARY

7th CEREBROVASCULAR GRAND ROUND Webinar, 13 July 2021

The 7 th chapter of the great Cerebrovascular Grand Round Webinar, held under the auspices of the MENA STROKE Organization, American Stroke Association, and World Stroke Organization, and supported by Boehringer Ingelheim and Medtronic, was an instructive session that provided comprehensive education about Ischemic Stroke, Secondary Stroke Prevention and its latest treatments and management. 1661 delegates from 42 countries around the world have been benefited from this webinar. It was conducted in a very organized and effective manner and the attendees have been rewarded with 2 CME hours.

Dr. Suhail Abdulla Alrukn, President of MENASO and Consultant Neurology at Rashid Hospital, UAE, has appointed **Dr. Taleb M. Almansoori**, Assistant professor of Radiology, College of Medicine and Health Sciences, United Arab Emirates University,

Dr. Isam Sayed Salih, Consultant - Neurovascular - Chairman of Division, Sheikh Shakhbout Medical City, Abu Dhabi, UAE as Chairmen for the webinar and Dr. Syed Irteza Hussain, Department Chair, Neurology, Neurological Institute, Cleveland Clinic Abu Dhabi, and Dr. Mohammed Al Kuwaiti, Consultant Neurologist at Tawam Hospital, Al Ain, UAE as the speakers.

Webinar Chairmen **Dr. Taleb M. Almansoori** has delivered the opening remarks and introduced **Dr. Syed Irteza Hussain** to deliver his lecture on Relevance of the cerebral collateral circulation in ischemic stroke.

He started the session with an introduction to cerebral collateral circulation, which he refers to as a network of vascular channels that provide alternative routes for blood flow when the primary route fails. The lecture covered the topics such as intracranial collaterals, extracranial collaterals, imaging of collaterals, collateral flow augmentation, and compared the influence of different assessment techniques.

He said that collaterals preserve tissue in the acute ischemic model and influence infarct growth and final infarct volume. **Dr. Syed** pointed out that additional research is ongoing on the augmentation of collaterals to improve outcomes.



Webinar Chairman **Dr. Isam Sayed Salih** has introduced and welcomed **Dr. Mohammed Al Kuwaiti** to deliver
the talk on Secondary Prevention of
Stroke.

His lecture on Secondary Prevention of Stroke was a rare informative session that centered on cryptogenic (ESUS) stroke secondary prevention. He defined cryptogenic stroke as a stroke of unknown cause and the term ESUS as Embolic Stroke of Undetermined Source.

Dr. Mohammed Al Kuwaiti focused on the approach in diagnosing the underlying cause of cryptogenic stroke, the potential role of Atrial fibrillation, and Atrial cardiopathy and PFO. He also shared the recommendations for stroke prevention in 2021.

Cryptogenic stroke is a very common diagnosis after a stroke and a complete workup is necessary to prevent it. Therapy is currently with antiplatelet unless specific etiology was identified. Prolonged cardiac monitoring increases rates of detecting atrial fibrillation.

He concluded that PFO closure remains reasonable in patients aged from 18 to 60 years.

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Webinar Chairmen Dr. Taleb M. Almansoori and Dr. Isam Sayed Salih have conducted the interactive Q&A session. They along with the speakers have expressed their appreciation and thanked the attendees for their participation.






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
